I first met "Patricia" down in our field as a two-year old. We lease our pastures to Mary Alice Larkin Matheson, Cleveland Bay breeder and fox-hunting barn operator, who summers her horses with us in the off-season to give her own fields a rest while not fox hunting. St. Patricia was turned out with the herd. When I would walk into our fields to hike, check on my own hunt horses or peruse the herd, I could always pick out Patricia...a big, round elegant bay horse with a beautiful head.

Time and time again, Patricia would leave the herd and come and say hello... basking in my attention. Our meetings became a secret ritual. I certainly did not confide with my husband about these sessions as he knows that my affection for a horse ultimately impacts our pocketbooks. Needless to say, I fell in love and so began my "affair" with St. Patricia.

When I asked Mary Alice if the "big bay mare" was for sale, she replied a cautious "Yes, but someone is looking at her." Not the kind to interfere with fellow hunt members' horse dealings, I decided to patiently wait for that "someone" to make up his mind. He did... knowing a good horse when he saw one, Mr. John Donovan of the Orange County Hunt purchased Patricia. I lamented not making an offer, but I was consoled in the fact that I would get to see her out hunting.

Dreaming of one of these beautiful big bay horses, I purchased Bianca, a tremendous 7/8 Cleveland Bay mare. Bianca and I had wonderful hunt seasons together—she always took great care of me— but I always watched Patricia out of the corner of my eye. After hunting I would often visit Patricia on her trailer, continuing our relationship despite her "marriage" to her new owner.

I would often even exercise Patricia when her owner, John, could not, continuing our illicit "affair."

Like a marriage, "compatibility" is the key to establish a relationship between horse and rider, and it became clear that John and Patricia were not "compatible". I thought that things might improve with time; but Patricia, a very smart mare, exploited every opportunity as an adolescent. John, who is a very kind-hearted soul, was just not stern enough with his testing, "teenager" and soon talked about selling her. I patiently awaited the "divorce."

When I got the call from Mary Alice that Patricia was, indeed, for sale and was I "interested?" my heart was again heavy. My own personal family circumstances prevented me from saying "yes" and I had to reluctantly decline. Patricia was, instead, sold to Mr. Larry Davis of the Orange County Hunt, and the two of

them formed a great marriage of spirited horse and rider over the the next three hunt seasons up front with the Master.

After a leave of absence from the hunt field, I was starting to ride again when, out of the blue, I received an unexpected call from Mary Alice with most interesting news: "Larry is hanging up his tack...are you interested in Patricia?" "Yes," was my answer, but I secretly wondered if we could rekindle our former "relationship." Two rides later, all doubts were erased "yes," I thought, "we could be great together."

I enlisted the help of Sue Lyman, show hunter trainer extraordinaire and Patricia settled into a new routine that she loved... "performing" in return for my adulation, either from the saddle or from the ground. To say that this mare loves attention is an understatement. She is poser to Nth degree and loves the fawning when she performs. After watching her school one day, I realized this special horse could be an amazing competitor and could showcase this breed in the Show Hunter ring.

Patricia's movement is exceptional, particularly for a Cleveland Bay (pardon the reality check), to the point that she is able to be competitive with some very fancy show hunters. I attribute a lot of her beautiful gaits to her sire, Penrhyn Bayswater. Charlie Matheson made an extremely great choice in his decision to import this sire. "Bayswater" is correct, has fluid gaits, a beautiful head and is a smart, gentle giant. His offspring are consistent... almost like rubber stamps.

I wanted people to know about this beautiful line of Cleveland Bays (that does not get a lot of attention because they are not actively campaigned), so I made the decision to show Patricia at Upperville to campaign the Penrhyn Bayswater line. I also wanted to know

if a Cleveland Bay could compete in the Hunter show ring. Cleveland Bays make great hunt horses but are not as often seen on the Class A Show Hunter circuit. I decided to try to campaign her in the show hunter ring to showcase this breed there.

And campaign we did...Patricia performed well this show season, earning a Reserve Championship and in the decent ribbons in several class "A," pre-green hunter shows with big, fancy classes. She won the Cleveland Bay Mid-Atlantic Series Championship, winning the Upperville Championship, Howard County Championship and the Warrenton Reserve Championship. I am constantly asked about her in the hunter ring... "what is her breeding?" To which I proudly respond "she is (part) Cleveland Bay."

One of the best rewards for my efforts this season was the receipt of a phone call from a breeder indicating that she had received purchase inquiries from spectators as a result of watching St. Patricia

compete. I am thrilled for the Cleveland Bay breed every time we extend the circle to newcomers to the breed as a result of showing off these beautiful horses. Our efforts are critical to the breed's survival via the investment of new owners.

Patricia and I no longer need to keep our seven-year affair a secret. After our last hunter show, when asked who owned the big bay mare, I replied to a very puzzled stranger "The 'affair' is over, St. Patricia is [finally] mine..."

Instead, I look forward to a long and happy "marriage" with this beautiful mare in the hunt field.

Many thanks to Charlie Matheson and Merry Fowler for breeding such a great line of horses, John Donovan and Larry Davis for doing the heavy lifting as Patricia grew up, Mary Alice for persisting, Marcia Brody for all her hard work to promote the breed with a stellar show circuit and Sue Lyman for showing and bringing out the best in this mare.

“The Breed Committee is to contact

known Purebred Cleveland Bay stallion owners by December 1 of each year to request the following information:

Is the stallion still available for breeding?
What is the availability of the stallion (frozen, AI and/or live cover)?

Information received is to be reported in the BayWatch, the CBHS Office Secretary for proper forwarding and Andy Dell, or the person responsible for compiling SPARKS sheets data. *The CBHSNA is not responsible for SPARKS data on stallions where the initial inquiry does unanswered.

The Breed committee is to place a note/article in every BayWatch and on the CBHSNA website requesting those with purebred Cleveland Bay horses, those who have sold/purchased purebred Cleveland Bay horses or those who own purebred Cleveland Bay stallion semen that is available in North America to contact the Breed Committee Chair at info@clevelandbay.org for both records purposes and inclusion in the SPARKS data sheets where applicable.”

5) Discussion of EMEC and its goals (see EMEC report)—Tina moved that, since we have the premium mare program available, that we stick with premium mare program and do away with the EMEC committee. Motion carried.

6) Calendar—BJ moves that we do a 2013 calendar with Café Press; motion carried

7) Another DVD (specifically regarding training the CB)—motion by Judy K. that sometime in the future the CBHSNA look into doing a DVD regarding training a CB from a foal up to one year and possibly some hints on how to handle a CB because of their special aspects as a purebred.

Judy amended her motion to change from a DVD to a series of training hints in the BayWatch. Motion carried

8) Brian moved that all regular meetings of the Board of Directors be recorded (if possible) for accurate drafting of the minutes.

9) Brian moves that photos of directors and committee chairs be submitted for posting on the website; after much grumbling, it was amended to make submission of photos optional; motion failed

10) Brian mentioned that we need to

reduce the number of committees; Milinda mentioned that doing that with some of the committees would require amendment of the Bylaws (the “standing committees” section of the Bylaws was read aloud for the benefit of the group). All attendees agreed that the number and arrangement of committees is too cumbersome.

11) Jenny moved the board investigate formation of regional groups. Jenny Y was going to work on this.

12) Proposal for location of next (2012) AGM: Gabrielle submitted a proposal to have next AGM in North Carolina in conjunction with the ALBC’s 2012 annual meeting; deferred to the next board meeting

I. Slideshow Presentation (Tracie Traver)

Our mission statement is too long and concise as it should be. It should be something that is easily remembered and easily repeated back. Some additional highlights: The purpose of Strategic planning to decide where we are and where we want to go. Define goals and objectives. And map a path or route to meet our goals and objectives. Goals should be translated into action plans. Goals can be lofty; but should be reachable. Be specific, be measureable and be in writing. Break down larger goals into a series of smaller goals to reach your objectives. Unity—it is impossible to achieve your goals if you are not united. Enemies of unity include a lack of shared purpose; gossip; sanctioned incompetence; failure to communicate and unresolved conflict. At the conclusion of the presentation it was agreed that we will evaluate our mission statement later in the meeting. Tracie reviewed some Current Projects and some ongoing projects that need to be discussed:

Current projects—

1. Inspector application
2. Frozen Semen Program
3. Rules Documents—There is no ongoing rules document to keep track of ongoing rules.
4. Document Storage
5. Formation of Regional Groups
6. Motion to make another DVD

Ongoing projects: website, membership, Facebook, AGM, Ambassador Award Program, and membership support to name a few.

Committee Review: We have 15 committees with a total of 16 people serving on all those committees. It was agreed this is not ideal.

II. Seminar Review of ALBC Seminar - Tricky Business of Managing a Breed Assoc. —Merry, Gabrielle, Sharon and Judy attended the seminar and shared some things that they had learned. The notes from the seminar were shared with the rest of the board to be looked at and discussed at the next Board Meeting. Mike Kerr makes a motion refer the ALBC seminar discussion to the post AGM board meet-

IV. Call for new business proposals—none were put forward.

V. Appointment of Election Tellers:—Carlene Kerr, Donna McDowell, Jeannie Cave. 104 mailed; 41 were returned in mail and 1 hand delivered.

VI. Reports of officers

- a. Secretary's report—no report—Gabrielle asked the minutes reflect that Milinda resigned early September 2012.
- b. Treasurer's report—report submitted—Tracie Traver asked what our 2011 income and expenses were. Anna Cohen reported 2011 income was \$9,688.74 and expenses amounted to \$8,416.98 with a net income of \$1,251.76. It was agreed that we would discuss and approve the 2013 proposed budget later in the meeting.

- US Pony Club has again given us a nice write up in their last E News reminding members of our sponsorship program. Our PC recognition program was also mentioned in the attendees' packets at the USPC national meeting.

- Several members competed well at US Dressage Federation shows this year with Foxhollow Compass Rose, Hardscrabble Winter, and Idlehour Forio achieving the minimum scores to be listed as "eligible" on the All Breeds site.

- The field hunter program saw three horses fulfill the program requirements this year: On a Mission, WKF Chai Latte, and Braelea Park Wilful. One additional horse, Maidstone Julia, has nearly completed all the requirements of the program.

- One horse, Watson's Amirah, completed the requirements for the Lifetime Achievement Award program this year with photo and article for inclusion in the next issue of The Baywatch.

- In the "regular" PA program, eighteen members enrolled 23 horses (including 5 purebreds) in 34 discipline categories. For the first time ever, all discipline categories filled this year.

Cleveland Bay Ambassador Award Program

Purpose: To promote public awareness of Cleveland Bays by encouraging owners to exhibit their horses in public venues.

Cleveland Bay Ambassador Award Program Procedure

1. Recipients need not be CBHSNA members to receive an Ambassador Award
2. Unregistered horses are eligible to win a Cleveland Bay Ambassador Award one time unless that horse changes owners (we can help & steer towards registration and foster good sportsmanship).
3. Show/event organizers or participants (on the behalf of show/event organizers) may request Ambassador Awards from the Program Administrator. An Ambassador Award may be requested for any show or competition where at least one Cleveland Bay, pure-bred or part-bred, is expected to be represented. Two ribbons may be requested if there will be pure-breds and part-breds that are competing. To ensure availability, ribbons should be requested 4 weeks in advance of the event. Later requests will be accommodated whenever possible.
4. If there is only one Cleveland Bay (pure-bred or part-bred) competing, the Cleveland Bay Ambassador Award is given to that horse, regardless if that horse places in the show. If there are two or more Cleveland Bays, the Cleveland Bay Ambassador award goes to the horse with the most points. If pure-breds are competing against part-breds, one ribbon is awarded to the high point pure-bred and another ribbon is awarded to the high point part-bred.
5. It is requested that upon presentation of the ribbon in the arena, an announcement be made over the PA system saying that "(said horse) has been presented with a CBHSNA Cleveland Bay Ambassador Award."
6. It is requested that the Cleveland Bay Ambassador Award recipient submit at least one photo of the winner with the ribbon, with CBHSNA photo release and credits (to be provided to recipient), for promotional use by the CBHSNA. A story or article is strongly encouraged for publication with the requested photo.

7. Show/event organizers (the individual who requested the Awards) are requested to contact the Cleveland Bay Ambassador Award Program Administrator with the name(s) and contact information of the winner(s) of the Ambassador Award and coordinate the return of any unused ribbons.

8. The Ambassador Award Program Administrator or designated representative from the Show Committee will make a personal congratulatory call to the winner of the award to not only congratulate the winner but encourage photo submission and/or brief article. The Ambassador Award Program Administrator will also mail to the winner a congratulatory card that provides a written note of congratulations as well as a copy of the winner registration form and a CBHSNA photo release/credit form. The note will also offer instructions about where to return the two forms and how to submit the photo and article.

9. If the recipient happens not to be a CBHSNA member then the Show Committee will refer the individual to the chair of the Membership Committee. The Membership Committee will then take measures to personally invite the individual to join the CBHSNA and also offer information about the PA Program.

10. If the winning horse is not registered with CBHS or CBHSA then the Show Committee will refer the individual to the chair of the Breed Committee. The Breed Committee can then take measures to help with the registration process, if the owner so desires.
